HISTORICAL

Central Manor Camp Meeting was inaugurated Sept. 1893. It was under the pastorate of Rev. I. A. MacDannald, D. D. of the Church of God at Washingtonboro, Pa. It began with nineteen tents and was so successful that there was a demand for its continuation. It was conducted for a few years by the Church at Washingtonboro. The ground was rented up to 1904 when the present Association was formed and the grove purchased. We have a good auditorium and a splendid Young People's Tabernacle, largely the gift of Mr. H. C. Brunner, Deceased, of Mount Joy, Pa. We have a Dining Hall that can accommodate two hundred at a meal. The Dormitory is arranged for the accommodation of a number of guests. There is a well of ice cold water on the grounds. The grounds are lighted by electricity.

Camp opens on Saturday evening, August 19 and closes Sabbath evening, August 27, 1933.

INFORMATION

Tents can be secured by writing to D. E. Bitner, Washingtonboro, Pa., or I. A. MacDannald, Lemoyne, Pa. Tenters, who want

their tents of last year, must notify Mr. Bitner by a return of the card sent them before July 1, 1933. All others desiring tents must make application before August 1, 1933.

Tents will rent for six dollars for the term. Persons, ordering tents and failing to occupy them, will be expected to pay the tent rent. No cottages will be rented this year.

Cots will be rented for the term for 50 cents each. They must be ordered when tents are ordered or the management will not guarantee to supply them.

There will be no automobile hack from Mountville to Camp. It has not justified the expense for years and the management is

compelled to cut out this expense. If strangers come to Mountville and will telephone the Camp, some one will be sent to meet them.

There will be a comfortable cottage for entertainment of ladies, a limited number can be accommodated. Write early, if you desire lodging in cottage.

Examine the rules of the Camp when you come and seek to carry them out, so that in every way you may seek to cooperate with the management. No luxuries will be sold on the Sabbath Day.

Parents are urged to see that children do not damage any property of the Association.

Cottages may be erected by individuals for the sum of \$175.00. These must be erected under the conditions laid down by the Board of Managers. If you desire to erect a cottage, apply to I. A. MacDannald, Lemoyne, Pa.

Young people desiring tents must have an older person as a chaperone who will be responsible for the conduct of those in the tent.

The attention of the Churches, Sabbath Schools and Endeavor Societies is called to the fact, that Dr. A. B. Bunn van Ormer, Professor of Psychology at Juniata College, Huntingdon, Penna, will deliver lectures each evening to Young People. This with the splendid corps of Bible Teachers on the program will make a splendid place to send Young People. They may enjoy the entire Programme of this Conference at an expense of eight dollars and fifty cents. The teaching of this Conference will be strictly Fundamental, and no Church, Society or Family will run any risk in sending their Young People to this Conference.
