HISTORICAL

Central Manor Camp Meeting was inaugurated Sept. 1893. It was under the pastorate of Rev. I. A. MacDannald, D. D. of the Church of God at Washingtonboro, Pa. It began with nineteen tents and was so successful that there was a demand for its continuation. It was conducted for a few years by the Church at Washingtonboro. The ground was rented up to 1904 when the present Association was formed and the grove purchased. We have a good auditorium and a splendid Young People's Tabernacle, largely the gift of Mr. H. C. Brunner, Deceased, of Mount Joy, Pa. We have a Dining Hall that can accommodate two hundred at a meal. The Dormitory is arranged for the accommodation of a number of guests. There is a well of ice cold water on the grounds. The grounds are lighted by electricity.

Camp opens on Saturday evening, August 23 and closes Sunday evening, August 31, 1947.

INFORMATION

Tents can be secured by writing to Rev. W. R. Weaver, Washington Boro, Pa. Tenters who want their tents of last year, must no-

tify Rev. W. R. Weaver, by a return of the card sent them before July 1, 1947. All others desiring tents must make application before August 1, 1947.

Tents will rent for six dollars for the term. Persons, ordering tents and failing to occupy them will be expected to pay the tent rent.

Cots will be rented for the term for 50 cents each. They must be ordered when tents are ordered or the management will not guarantee to supply them.

When you come to Camp, remember that this meeting is arranged solely for Religious Service. Those who labor to maintain the Camp do not want it to be a rest resort or a modern Camp Meeting. If you want a worldly outing find it somewhere else. We do not want people who do not regularly attend the services to apply for tents. Any persons who do not regularly attend the services this year need not apply for tents next year. If you attend the services, you will go away thankful that you have had the privilege of attending so good a meeting. Remain away from the services and you will wonder why you came to such a dull place. Pray much for the Camp and those who will speak. Bring your Bibles and Pray—Pray—Pray.

There will be a comfortable cottage for entertainment of ladies, a limited number can be accommodated. Write early, if you desire lodging in cottage.

Examine the rules of the Camp when you come and seek to carry them out, so that in every way you may seek to cooperate with the management.

We must depend upon Christian men and women, who tent on the ground, to assist the management to preserve order. All persons should be in their tents or cottages and quieted down by the time the last bell taps at night.

No luxuries will be sold on the Lord's Day.

Parents are urged to see that children do not damage any property of the Association.

In the matter of the erection of Cottages, The Board of Managers cannot offer these at the rate usually offered. If any one should desire to erect a Cottage, an estimate will be made as to the actual cost and the Cottage will be erected without any profit to the Association.

Young people desiring tents must have an older person as a chaperon who will be responsible for the conduct of those in the tent. THIS IS IMPERATIVE.

Our Young People's program makes this Camp Meeting a splendid place to send Young People. They can spend the entire time at the Camp at an expense of \$10.00 Young people need the same plan of Salvation that old people need which begins with a born again experience. The teaching of this Camp is strictly Fundamental and no church, Society or family will run any risk in sending their young people to this Camp Meeting.

Every Cottage and Tent will be furnished with Electric light. One dollar will be charged for this service. All persons are requested not to use the Electric light for any other purpose than light.

Any person or persons who disturb the Cottage or tent of any one will be summarily dealt with. Rowdiness cannot be tolerated on the ground.

A Cottage has been erected by Mr. Ivan Herr of Columbia for the use of lady Missionaries who may be the Guests of the Association.

A cottage for male missionaries on furlough has been erected by Rev. H. S. Bickel, deceased.

We aim to give the Camp the benefit of the very best speakers we can secure. We could lower the standard of the program offered and the Camp would gradually die. You can help us by your prayers, contributions and cooperation.

The Board of Managers at their meeting April 18, 1936 passed a resolution inviting any furloughed Missionaries who may desire to take advantage of our splendid program, to be the guests of the Association for any time they can spend at the meeting. Any Missionary who believes in the Fundamentals of our faith will be welcome to the meeting and will be entertained free of charge if they will communicate with Rev. W. R. Weaver, Washington Boro, Pa. This action is to be a permanent invitation to furloughed missionaries.

The services of the Camp will be arranged on D.S.T., except the evening services which will be one-half hour later than usual. The 6:15 P. M. service at 6:45 P. M. and the 7:45 P. M. service at 8:00 P. M.

The Board of Managers by action unanimously has decided that the offering on each Missionary Day shall go into a fund to pay the voyage expenses of Dr. Gilbert to and from India.

No lumber can be bought from the Association towards building porches or platforms for Cottages owned by Individuals. The supply of lumber is being exhausted. Persons desiring to make repairs must secure their lumber elsewhere.

There will be no telephone on the Camp Grounds. Persons who desire to reach the Camp by phone should call Kauffman Repair Shop this telephone is on Millersville Exchange No. 5771.

Ministers and wives should see the General Manager for special rates for Boarding and Lodging.

The 55th Annual Campmeeting will not be what it should be unless there are souls saved. All the years of the Camp, souls have been coming to Christ. Many have made decisions that we will not know of until we meet in Glory. As you come to this meeting Pray and labor for salvation of your friends.

The Board of Managers at its late meeting have started a Building Fund. This Fund will be used toward the building of a better Dining Hall and Rooms for visitors on the second floor. They solicit gifts toward this Fund by all who are interested in perpetuating this Camp Meeting and Conference as a place where those who desire it can find a place for real Religious recreation.
