HISTORICAL

Central Manor Camp Meeting was inaugurated Sept. 1893. It was under the pastorate of The Reverend I. A. MacDonald, D.D., of the Church as Washington Boro, Pa. It began with nineteen tents. It was conducted for a few years by the Church at Washington Boro. The Ground was rented up to 1904 when the present Association was formed, and the grove purchased. We have a good auditorium and an excellent dining hall.
