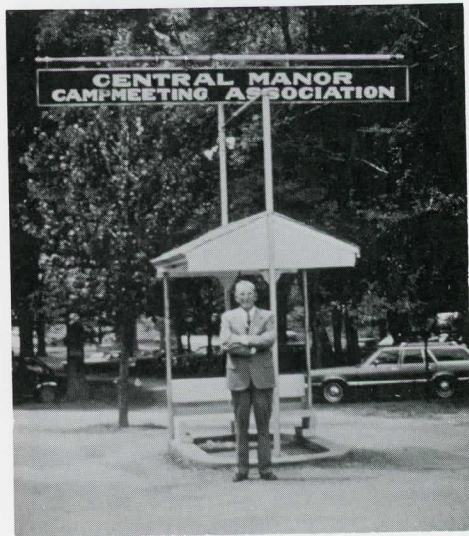

It was conducted for a few years by the Church at Washington Boro. The Ground was rented up to 1904 when the present Association was formed, and the grove purchased. We have a good auditorium and an excellent dining hall.

INFORMATION

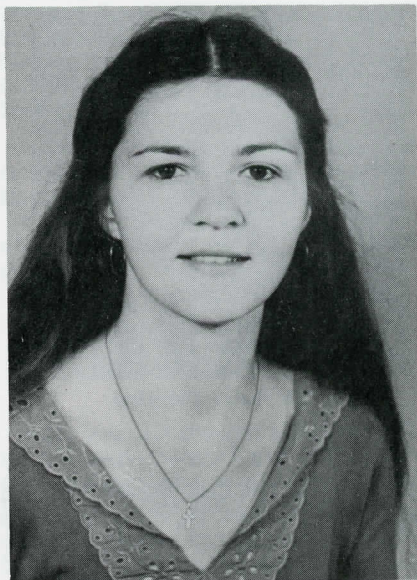
Cottages, when available will rent for fifty-five dollars.

DRESS GUIDE LINE FOR CAMP MANOR

After much prayer and consideration the Board of Directors hereby request the campers and visitors to the camp to let their dress style be in a manner in which Christ is Glorified! Modesty and Christian grace must be uppermost in our minds during the camping season.

The Board of Directors feels that styles and designs of clothing which are immodest are not appropriate for use during the entire conference.

The Board of Directors and Managers of the Camp shall use their discretion in determining immodest dress and shall suggest appropriate action. This dress guideline applies to campers as well as non-campers, and gentlemen as well as the ladies.

PLEASE NOTE

People who bring their pets to camp are requested to be in command of the pet at all times.

Young people desiring cottages must have an older person as chaperone who will be responsible for the conduct of those in the cottage. This is IMPERATIVE.

Young people need the same plan of Salvation that older people need which begins with a born again experience.. The teaching of this camp is strictly fundamental and no church, society or family will run any risk in sending their young people to this camp meeting.

Any person or persons who disturb the cottage of anyone will be summarily dealt with. Rowdiness cannot be tolerated on the ground.

We aim to give the camp the benefit of the very best speakers we can secure. We could lower the standard of the program offered and the camp would gradually die. You can help us by your prayers, contribu-

tions and cooperation.

The Board of Managers at their meeting April 18, 1936 passed a resolution inviting any furloughed Missionaries who may desire to take advantage of our splendid program to be the guests of the Association for any time they can spend at the meeting. Any Missionary who believes in the fundamentals of the faith will be welcome to the meetings and will be entertained free of charge if they will communicate with Ralph Kilheffer, Washington Boro, Pa. 17582. This section is to be a permanent invitation to furloughed Missionaries.

When you come to Camp remember that this meeting is arranged solely for Religious Service. Those who labor to maintain the Camp do not want it to be a resort or modern Camp Meeting. If you want a Worldly outing find it somewhere else. We do not want people who do not regularly attend the Services to apply for cottages. If you attend the services, you will go away thankful that you have had the privilege of attending so good a meeting. Remain away from the services and you will wonder why you came to such a dull place. Pray much for the camp and those who will speak. Bring your Bibles, and Pray! Pray! Pray!

Examine the rules of the Camp when you can and seek to carry them out, so that in every way you may seek to cooperate with the management.

We must depend upon Christian men and women, who reside on the ground, to assist the management to preserve order.

All persons should be in their cottages and quieted down by 11 P.M.
