HISTORICAL

Shortly before the turn of the century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. This came to fruition and the first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle - twenty feet by fifty feet in size - was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now one hundred and sixteen cabins.

Our present auditorium now accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred at one meal.

In recent years the association has been incorporated and we now function as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

LOCATION

Central Manor Park is located two miles south of Mountville, one-fourth mile north of Route 999, midway between Millersville and Washington Boro.

SPEAKERS

Dr. Alden A. Gannett has ministered as President of London Bible College and Southeastern Bible College and taught at Dallas Bible College and Theological Seminary. He has served as a pastor in Texas and Minister-at-Large for UFM, Int'l. He is the Founder and President of Gannett Ministries, Inc. and continues to faithfully preach the Word of God, as well as, serve on numerous Boards and Councils of Reference.

Rev. Bernard Briscoe has had 30 years experience in a preaching ministry that extended around the world. He began his full time ministry with his brother Stuart at Elmbrook Church in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Rev. Briscoe and his wife Helen served five years with Overseas Missionary Fellowship. He worked as conference speaker, Bible teacher and as Secretary/Treasurer of O.M.F. Currently, Rev. Briscoe is pastoring the Lake Drive Baptist Church in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He is imminently well qualified with a wealth of expository Bible teaching and conference ministry experience. His style of incisive, analytical exposition with ready humor and down to earth application make the message clear and implications plain.

Rev. Arthur H. Larson has been in the ministry 29 years, serving churches in Pennsylvania, New York and Canada. He served as Assistant General Director of Global

Outreach Mission and has preached in Europe, India, Middle East, Central and South America, and the Caribbean. Presently he is the Associate Pastor of Boca Raton Community Church and continues to travel and preach God's Word across North America in Bible Conferences, Churches and Christian Schools. Rev. Larson and his wife Wanda have four children, Lori, Tim, Sharon and Carol.

Dr. Andrew Telford is one of the outstanding preachers of the Word of God in our country. He has been ministering the Word for over sixty-five years. Because of his faithfulness to the Word, fervency in spirit, and forceful presentation of the Word, he is always in demand. His years of pulpit and radio preaching have been a blessing to thousands. Although Dr. Telford is over ninety years of age, he continues to preach more than forty weeks a year maintaining the zeal and devotion of former years. He has served more than thirty-five years at Camp Manor.

DRESS GUIDELINE FOR CAMP MANOR

After much prayer and consideration, the Board of Directors hereby requests the campers and visitors to the camp to let their dress style be in a manner in which Christ is glorified! Modesty and Christian grace must be uppermost in our minds during the camping season.

The Board of Directors feels that styles and designs of clothing which are immodest are not appropriate for use during the entire conference.

The Board of Directors and Managers of the Camp shall use their discretion in determining immodest dress and shall suggest appropriate action. This dress guideline applies to campers as well as non-campers, and gentlemen as well as the ladies.

PLEASE NOTE:

It is not unusual in our culture to become busy with our own responsibilities. Central Manor Camp provides a place where one can come and relax in the beautiful surroundings and be refreshed by the ministry of God's Word. During the week, the camp provides spiritual enrichment through programs for children, youth and adults. Specifically, God has provided speakers, who have dedicated their lives to the building of God's kingdom. They evidence exceptional ability in communicating His Word, and demonstrate Godly character. The Board desires your support and involvement in this special ministry through your faithful prayers, consistent attendance at the services, contributions and coopera-

tion. Pray with us that as God's Word is expounded, we may witness the salvation of souls, and the edification of believers.

The Board of Directors at their meeting April 18, 1936, passed a resolution inviting any furloughed missionaries who may desire to take advantage of our splendid program, to be the guests of the Association for any time they can spend at the meeting. Any missionary who believes in the fundamentals of the faith will be welcome to the meetings and will be entertained free of charge if they will communicate with Paul Habecker, Washington Boro, PA 17582. This section is to be a permanent invitation to furloughed missionaries.

Young people desiring cottages must have an older person as chaperone who will be responsible for the conduct of those in the cottage. Parents are urged to see that their children do not damage any property of the Association.

Any person or persons who disturb the cottage of anyone will be dealt with. Rowdiness cannot be tolerated on the grounds.

People who bring their pets to camp are requested to be in command of the pet at all times.

Examine the rules of the Camp and seek to carry them out, so that in every way you may seek to cooperate with the management.

We must depend upon Christian men and women, who reside on the ground, to assist the management to preserve order.

All persons should be in their cottages and quiet by 11 P.M.
