CENTRAL MANOR CAMPMEETING CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

The vision of Dr. I. A. MacDannald who was led of the Lord to start the Campmeeting in 1892, continues. With a vision for the future and in appreciation for the past the Centennial Committe is prayfully at work on the following projects, among others for the 1992, Campmeeting session.

1. **PROGRAM:** The preachers and special events planned for the camp will show that the vision burns as bright as ever. We believe as we share this celebration there will be a spiritual harvest in the lives of many people transformed by the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.
2. **CENTENNIAL BOOK:** It will include all you ever wanted to know about Campmeeting, but didn't know who to ask, the people, the events, the pictures. A valuable historical document. A record of past blessings.
3. **VIDEO CASSETTE:** Our message is the same as 100, years ago. But some of our methods change with the technology of our generation. A professionally produced video of the Centennial Celebration will preserve the event for convenient home viewing. We believe it will be useful as a means of Evangelism, bringing the message and mission of Central

Manor Campmeeting to friends and neighbors.

4. HISTORICAL DOCUMENTS AND MEMORABILIA: A public display area and permanent repository for historical items and pictures will be constructed. Any such items you possess and would like to give to the Camp for safe keeping and occasional display will be appreciated.

HISTORICAL

Shortly before the turn of the century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. This came to fruition and the first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle - twenty feet by fifty feet in size - was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now one hundred and twenty eight cabins.

Our present auditorium now accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

In recent years the association has been incorporated and we now function as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

LOCATION

Central Manor Park is located two miles south of Mountville, one-fourth mile north of Route 999, midway between Millersville and Washington Boro.

SPEAKERS

Dr. Rick Yohn is Senior Pastor of Northwest Bible Church in Dallas, Texas. A native of Lancaster, Pennsylvania, Dr. Yohn graduated from Philadelphia College of the Bible. He holds a Masters degree in theology from Dallas Theological Seminary and a Doctorate degree from Talbot Theological Seminary. The reputation Dr. Yohn has as an expositor of the Word has placed him in great demand as a speaker at family and Bible conferences, as well as college and seminary campuses. His wife, Linda, is also a gifted speaker and teacher. They have two sons, Rick and Steven.

Rev. David M. Barr is thoroughly committed to the cause of Evangelism. Since he entered full-time evangelistic work at the age of 27, Rev. Barr has been firmly convinced that evangelism is one of the important means through which God exercises His saving power. His belief resulted during World War II while serving in the United States Navy overseas. His conversion experience caused a revolutionary change in his life. It has been strengthened in the years since then, as he has seen thousands of men and women brought to a saving faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Rev. Barr's ministry has

taken him to all parts of the world including many Communist nations. When not traveling, Rev. Barr makes his home in Annville, Pennsylvania.

Rev. Eric G. Crichton comes from a Scottish Presbyterian background, having been born in Scotland and brought up in Toronto, Canada. Pastor Crichton studied at Universities in Canada and England before preparing for the pastorate at Moody Bible Institute. Pastor Crichton served as Pastor of Willowdale Baptist Church, Toronto, Canada; as Associate Pastor of Moody Church, Chicago; as Pastor of Kildare Avenue Baptist Church, Chicago; before coming to Calvary Church in Lancaster where he served 23 years. Pastor Crichton has ministered at Bible Conferences in the United States, Canada, Japan and the Carriibbean. Presently, he serves on several mission boards and is engaged in Bible Conference and Mission Conference ministry.

Dr. Andrew Telford is one of the outstanding preachers of the Word of God in our Country. He has been ministering the Word for over sixty-eight years. Because of his faithfulness to the Word, fervency in spirit, and forceful presentation of the Word, he is always in demand. His years of pulpit and radio preaching have been a blessing to thousands. Although Dr. Telford is over ninety six years of age, he continues to preach, maintaining the zeal and devotion of former years. He has served more than forty years at Camp Manor.
