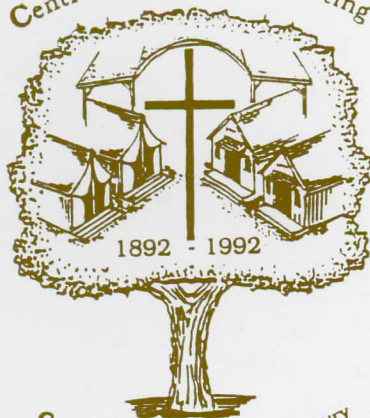

Diane King Susek was born into a Christian home where music is a way of life. Her singing career began as a child and increased through her grade school and teenage years. While a student at Ithaca College, Diane committed her talent to Christian service. Diane married Evangelist Ron Susek in 1968. She then entered the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore and received

her degree in music. Diane has released nine sacred albums, one of which received the award of Best Album of the Year from the National Evangelical Film Foundation. The same foundation honored her as Best Female Soloist of the Year. She continues to sing on radio and television programs both nationally and internationally. Diane King Susek has one purpose and goal in singing, and that is to honor Christ with a ministry to the minds, hearts and souls of people.

Michael Faircloth studied piano at the Peabody Preparatory Department of the Johns Hopkins University and received a Bachelor of Music Degree and a Master's Degree in piano performance from the University of Maryland. He has recorded four piano solo albums and appeared in concerts with Diane Susek, Scott Smith, Steve Green, Larnelle Harris, Dave Boyer, Steve Amerson, Glad, The Gaither Vocal Band, Christine Wyrzten and Nancy Honeytree. He has received many awards for his artistry and ministry in music. Currently Michael is Artist in Residence at Sandy Cove Bible Conference, North East, Maryland. Michael's ministry is one of unusual clarity and strength. His warm heart and evident love for our Lord take his music from merely an enjoyable experience to meaningful worship and praise.

## HISTORICAL

Shortly before the turn of the century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. This came to fruition and the first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle - twenty feet by fifty feet in size - was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now one hundred and thirty cabins.

Our present auditorium now accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

In recent years the association has been incorporated and we now function as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

## LOCATION

Central Manor Park is located two miles south of Mountville, one-fourth mile north of Routh 999, midway between Millersville and Washington Boro.

## SPEAKERS

Dr. Donald R. Hubbard has held several pastorates over the past forty years in the Midwest, Northeast and South. He is currently the Senior Pastor of the Boca Raton Community Church, Boca Raton, Florida. Greatly interested in missions, Dr. Hubbard has served on the boards of several large faith missions. His speaking ministry has taken him to approximately fifty countries of the world as well as to numerous major Bible conference centers. He and Mrs. Hubbard, the former Joy Harbaugh, are the parents of four children.

Dr. Lehman Strauss has pastored churches in Bristol, Pa. and Detroit, Mich. In 1963 he left the pastorate and began a Bible teaching ministry in churches throughout the United States and mission fields in other countries. He had a weekly radio ministry called Bible Study Time and has written commentaries on Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, James, the Epistle of John, Daniel and Revelation. He resides in Escondido, CA.

Rev. Arthur H. Larson has been in the ministry 33 years, serving churches in Pennsylvania, New York and Canada. He served

as Assistant General Director of Global Outreach Mission and has preached in Europe, India, Middle East, Central and South America, and the Carribean. Presently he is the Associate Pastor of Boca Raton Community Church and continues to travel and preach God's word across North America. Rev. Larson and his wife, Wanda have four children.

Dr. Andrew Telford is one of the outstanding preachers of the Word of God in our Country. He has been ministering the Word for over sixty-nine years. His years of pulpit and radio preaching have been a blessing to thousands. Although Dr. Telford is 97., he continues to minister the Word with the devotion of former years. He has preached at Camp Manor for 45 years.
