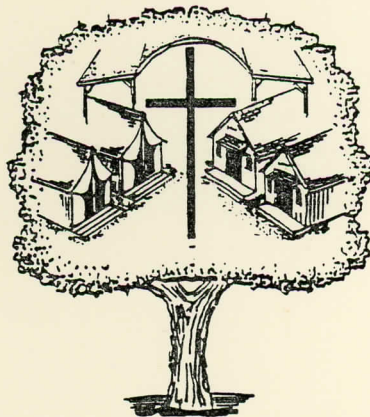

HISTORICAL

Shortly before the turn of the century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. This came to fruition and the first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle - twenty feet by fifty feet in size - was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now one hundred and forty cabins.

Our present auditorium now accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

In recent years the association has been incorporated and we now function as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

LOCATION

Central Manor Park is located two miles south of Mountville, one-fourth mile north of Route 999, midway between Millersville and Washington Boro.

SPEAKERS

Dr. Alden A. Gannett has ministered as President of London Bible College and Southeastern Bible College and taught at Dallas Bible College and Theological Seminary. He has served as a pastor in Texas and Minister-at-Large for UFM, Int'l. He is the Founder and President of Gannett Ministries, Inc. and continues to faithfully preach the Word of God, as well as, serve on numerous Boards and Councils of Reference.

Dr. J. Ronald Blue has served with The Central American Mission for about 10 years; both as field missionary in Guatemala and later in leadership ministry. From 1975 to 1992 he was chairman and professor in the Department of World Missions at Dallas Theological Seminary, and since then has served as the president of CAM International. Dr. Blue comes with an outstanding scholastic background; having achieved numerous degrees and a variety of educational honors and awards. He has been privileged to have traveled in more than 40 countries. He and his wife, Libby reside in Dallas, TX, and are the parents of three children.

Dr. Robert J. Willey, Jr. earned a B.S. degree from Philadelphia College of Bible, and a M.A. and Ed. D. degree from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in Illinois. Prior to assuming the position of Academic Dean at Lancaster Bible College, Dr. Willey served for 10 years as an assistant professor in the Biblical Studies and Arts and Sciences Divisions. He is a frequent speaker at churches and seminars, and has conducted numerous tours to Israel. He has also led student/travel learn teams to Russia and Western Europe. Dr. Willey and his wife, Doreen live in Manheim, PA. They have two daughters.

In sacred and classical music Ron and Gary Matthews are one of the most gifted and dynamic duet teams in North America. They are duo vocalists, pianists, organists and trumpeters. With this combination of superlative talent, these brothers bring to every concert a rare and uplifting musical experience, but most importantly a rich spirit of worship.

Dr. Ron Matthews is Professor of Music and Director of Music Programs at Eastern College in St. David's, PA and organist Music Director at Calvary Presbyterian Church in Willow Grove, PA. Ron and his wife, Pamela have two sons. They reside in Hatboro, PA.

Rev. Gary Matthews is the Minister of Music and Worship at Highland Park Baptist

Church, Southfield, MI. Gary and his wife, Cindy, have three daughters. They reside in Southfield.

Derrill and Judy Dersch, sensing the Lord's call to ministry, left the business world to attend classes at Lancaster Bible College. With their natural creativity, and their musical teaching, and organizational gifts; they have served in various capacities. 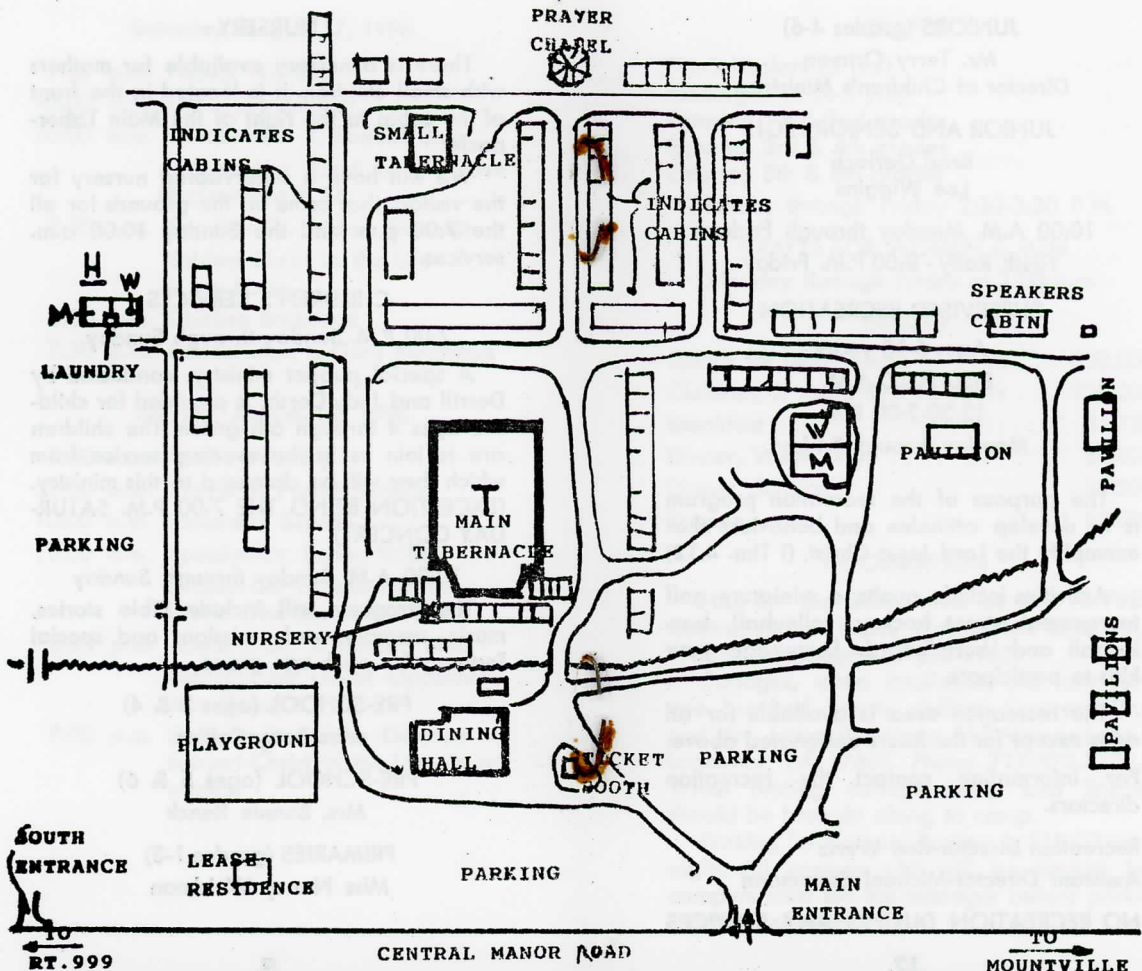
