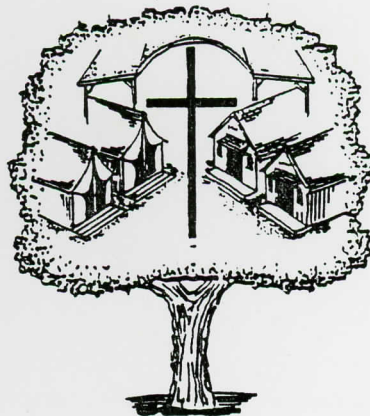

## HISTORICAL

Shortly before the turn of the century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. This came to fruition and the first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle—twenty feet by fifty feet in size—was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now one hundred and forty cabins.

Our present auditorium now accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

In recent years the association has been incorporated and we now function as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

## LOCATION

Central Manor Park is located two miles south of Mountville, one-fourth mile north of Route 999, midway between Millersville and Washington Boro.

## SPEAKERS

Dr. David A. Clemens has been involved in a national and international Bible teaching ministry for over 25 years, conducting Biblical Living Skills Conferences. He is the author of "Steps to Maturity," a three-volume series of Biblical living skills, and currently serves as Bible teacher and minister-at-large of BCM International, Inc. formerly Bible Club Movement. Dr. Clemens has served in the pastorate and on the mission field, and he and his wife, Janice, now reside in Marlton, NJ. They have two sons, Stephen and Daniel.

Dr. Donald R. Hubbard has held several pastorates over the past forty years in the Midwest, Northwest and South, one of the more recent ones being Calvary Baptist Church of New York City. He is currently active in conducting Bible conferences as well as assisting in the training of pastors and church leaders in third-world countries. Greatly interested in missions, Dr. Hubbard has served on boards of several large faith missions. His ministry has taken him to many countries of the world as well as numerous major conference centers. Dr. Hubbard and his wife Joy are the parents of four children.

Professor Steve Layne is a graduate of Washington Bible College and Capital Bible Seminary, from which he received his Master of Divinity and Master of Theology degrees. He currently teaches NT Greek and Biblical studies at the College and Homiletics at the Seminary. He is also in the process of completing his Ph.D. in NT Greek. In addition to his full time teaching ministry, Professor Layne serves as a guest preacher for churches along the East Coast. He is married to his high school sweetheart, Jennifer, and they have two daughters, Hannah and Rachel.

## CHILDREN'S EVENING MINISTRY

Derrill and Judy Dersch along with Sherry Miller will be conducting the evening children's ministries. Derrill and Judy have a unique puppet ministry designed to present the gospel and teach the Word of God. They are from the Manheim area and worship and serve at the Lancaster Evangelical Free Church.

Sherry serves as Director of Discipleship at Central Manor Church of God. She has a BA from Philadelphia Bible College, a Master's Degree in Elementary Education, and is presently studying for a Master of Ministry Degree at Lancaster Bible College.

## MUSIC DIRECTOR

Dr. Bruce Gerlach serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a very gifted musician with a doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. He is professor of music at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri where he also serves as Director of Worship for the college church. Being the son of our association president, Norman Gerlach and his wife Elaine, Bruce has been a part of Camp since childhood. He and his wife Margie have two children.

## CONCERT

Henry and Hazel Slaughter are in their fourth decade of gospel music ministry, with over two dozen recordings reaching all parts of the United States and Canada. For several years they toured with the Bill Gaither Trio, and have also teamed with Doug Oldham. They are held in high esteem by their peers and acquaintances. Their down-home style of music is enjoyable, entertaining, inspiring and refreshing.

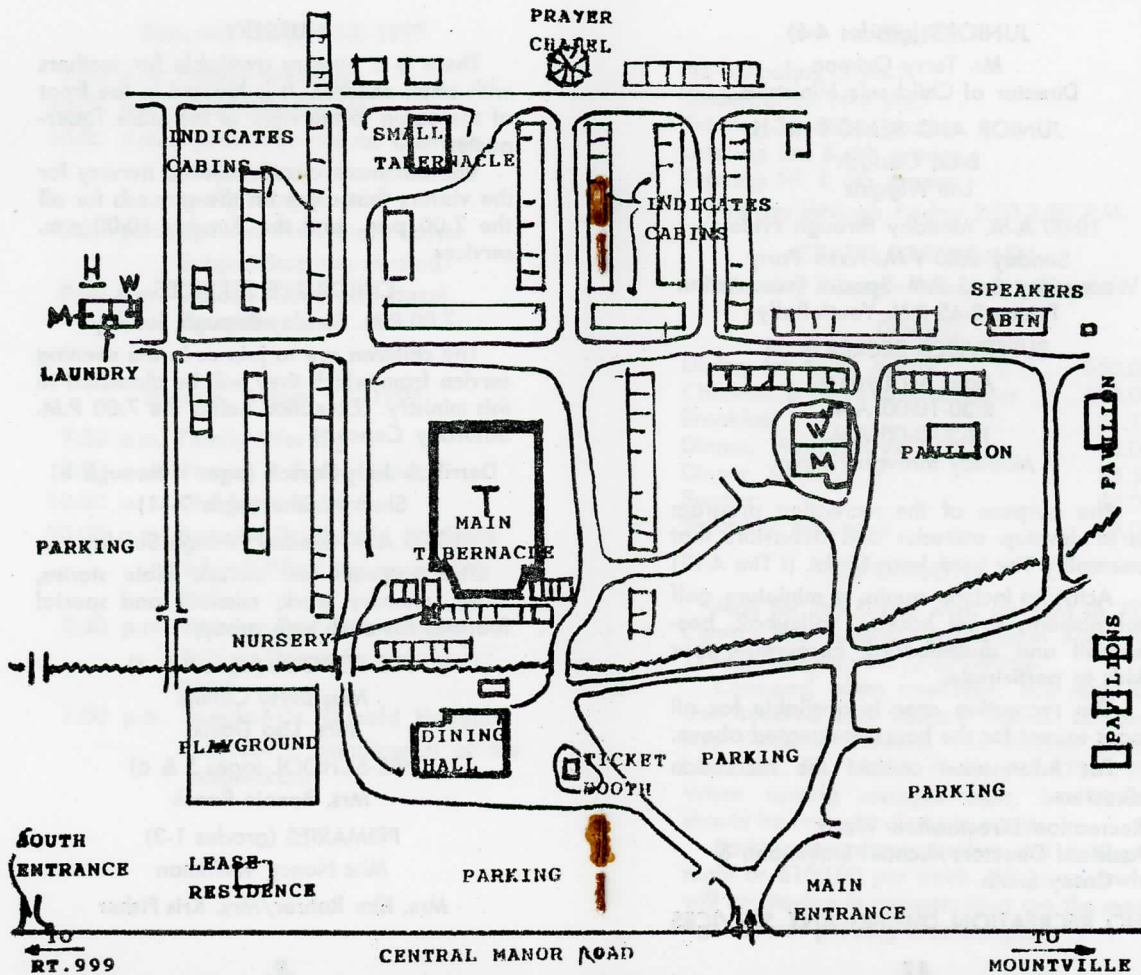
