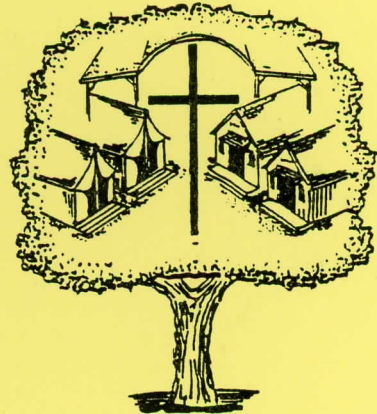

## HISTORICAL

Shortly before the beginning of the 20th century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. This came to fruition and the first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle—twenty feet by fifty feet in size—was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now one hundred and forty-six cabins.

Our present auditorium now accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

In recent years the association has been incorporated and we now function as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

## SPEAKERS

Dr. J. Ronald Blue has served with the Central American Mission for about 13 years; both as field missionary in Guatemala and later in leadership ministry. From 1975 to 1992 he was chairman and professor in department of World Missions at Dallas Theological Seminary, and since then has served as the president of CAM International. Dr. Blue comes with an outstanding scholastic background; having achieved numerous degrees and a variety of educational honors and awards. He has been privileged to have traveled in more than 40 countries. He and his wife, Libby reside in Dallas, Texas, and are the parents of three children.

Rev. Steve Layne is a graduate of Washington Bible College and Capital Seminary, from which he received his Masters of Divinity and Master of Theology degrees. He has been a professor of Bible and Theology at WBC/CBS for the past seven years. In addition to his teaching ministry, he is also in the process of completing his Ph.D. in NT Greek. As he is able, he serves as a guest preacher for churches in the Washington area. Prior to joining WBC/CBS, he served seven years as an associate pastor. He and Jennifer, his wife, have two daughters and are presently expecting the birth of their third child.

Rev. Walter McCord is pastor of First Community Church in Crandall, Texas. He

is a graduate of Penn State University, Philadelphia College of Bible, and Dallas Theological Seminary where he continues in study for a Ph. D. in Bible Exposition. A native of Pennsylvania, he has resided in Texas for the past 7 years. He and his wife, Brenda, have three sons, Mark, Jonathan, and Seth. Rev. McCord's practical application of the Old Testament prophets will challenge your life.

#### CHILDREN'S EVENING MINISTRY

Patti Barnhart along with Sherry Miller will be conducting the evening children's ministries.

Patti is also known as PJ the Clown. Specializing in children's ministries she uses the art of ventriloquism, music, puppets, Bible stories, and drama to teach Biblical truth. Patti resides in the Chambersburg area.

Sherry serves as Director of Discipleship at Central Manor Church of God. She has a BA from Philadelphia Bible College, a Master's Degree in Elementary Education, and is presently studying for a Master of Ministry Degree at Lancaster Bible College.

#### MUSIC DIRECTOR

Dr. Bruce Gerlach serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a very gifted musician with a doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. He is pro-

fessor of music at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri where he also serves as Director of Worship for the college church. Being the son of our association president, Norman Gerlach and his wife Elaine, Bruce has been a part of Camp since childhood. He and his wife Margie have two children.

#### CONCERT

Without a doubt Tim Archer is one of the premier singer/songwriters in contemporary Christian music today. His career began successfully in the 70's with the Archer Trio who were widely acclaimed in the contemporary Christian music field and who received many awards for their recordings and performances. Following the trio's disbanding in 1992, Tim continued his career independently as a singer/songwriter.

What is most apparent in Tim's music and performance is his heartfelt desire to see people uplifted, encouraged and changed by his positive message of God's love and grace. One Pastor commented, "Tim's appearance, professionalism, music selection and content, and over all audience response was outstanding. 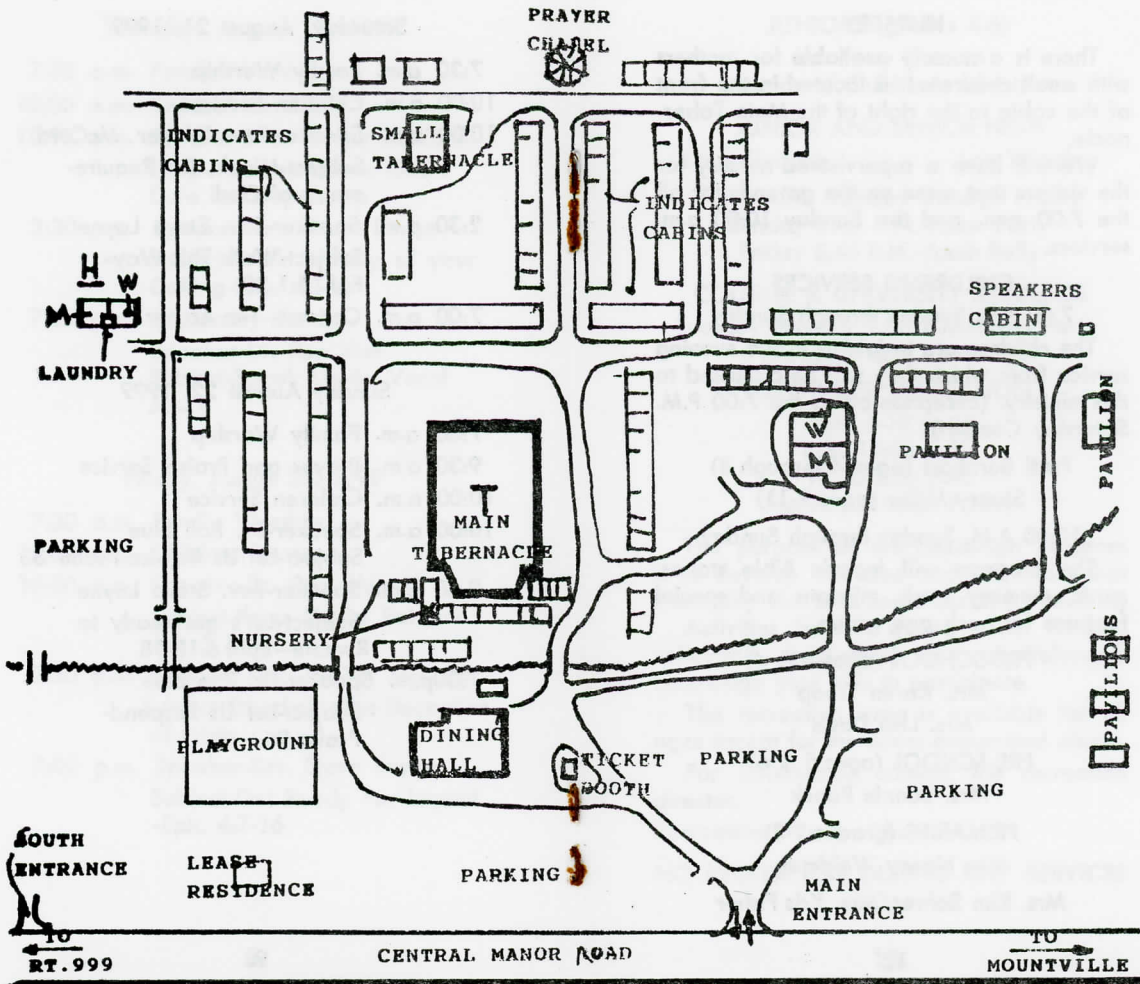
