HISTORICAL

Shortly before the beginning of the 20th century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. This came to fruition and the first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle—twenty feet by fifty feet in size—was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now one hundred and fifty-six cabins.

Our present auditorium now accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

In recent years the association has been incorporated and we now function as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

SPEAKERS

Dr. Donald R. Hubbard presents the Scriptures with clarity, warmth and humor. His effective exposition and practical application of the Scriptures brings a message of enlightenment, encouragement, and relevance to the hearer. Dr. Hubbard has served as the senior pastor of several churches in the eastern and southern United States including the famed Calvary Baptist Church of New York City. Since retiring from pastoral ministry in 1994, he has devoted his full time to assisting in the training of church and national leaders in developing countries as well as conducting Bible teaching ministries throughout the United States. His teaching and preaching ministry has taken him to conferences and seminars in over sixty countries. Some of the more recent ministries have taken him to Israel, Russia, Ukraine, Venezuela, Kazakstan, Germany and Argentina. Married to Joy Harbaugh, the Hubbards are parents of four children, have eight grandchildren and make their home in Boca Raton, Florida.

Rev. Arthur Larson began his pastoral ministries as Assistant Pastor to the late Dr. Andrew Telford at Berachah Church in Philadelphia. Since that time he has served as the senior pastor of a number of churches both in the United States and Canada. He has also served as Associate Pastor and Conference Director for Boca Raton Community Church in Biletown, Boca Raton, Florida. Presently

Rev. Larson speaks regularly on Canada's National Bible Hour, a broadcast heard coast to coast every Sunday through 55 Canadian stations, and is busily involved in conference ministry. In addition to Bible Conference ministry, his association with Global Outreach Mission has given him many opportunities to minister in mission conferences and to missionaries on a number of mission fields. Rev. Larson's devotion to God and His people is evident in his compassionate and challenging presentation of Biblical Truth. Art and his wife Wanda have four children and reside in Boca Raton, Florida.

Dr. Renald Showers has addressed college groups, church congregations and Bible conferences coast to coast, and has ministered in Europe, South America and New Zealand. His publications include "Liberty And Love In Life With Christ", "The Most High God", "The Eternal Sonship Of Christ", "Maranatha: Our Lord Come", and numerous magazine articles. He has served in the pastorate, as a member of the faculties of Lancaster Bible College, Moody Bible Institute and Philadelphia College of Bible, and as a visiting lecturer at Word of Life Bible Institute, Calvary Bible College and Baptist Bible Theological Seminary. He is presently on the staff of the Church Ministries Division of the Friends of Israel Gospel Ministry, Inc. and Teaches in the Institute of Biblical Studies of that ministry. Dr. Showers' comprehensive

knowledge of the Word, and particularly its prophetic truth, joined with his understanding of the present Middle East situation combine to bring us messages to help us see and understand the purposes of God in our present day. A native of DuBois, Pennsylvania, Dr. Showers is married to the former Eleanor Eby and they reside in nearby Willow Street.

Pastor H. Lee Wiggins a native of Pennsylvania grew up attending Central Manor Camp where five generations of Wiggins have found spiritual enrichment. Some of his most formative spiritual moments took place at camp. Until this year, for a good number of years, He has served as the director of our camp youth. Lee has a Master of Divinity degree from Western Seminary and for fourteen years has pastored in both Ohio and Arizona. He presently pastors at Prescott Heights Church in Prescott, Arizona. He and Anne, his wife, have one daughter Noelle.

CHILDREN'S EVENING MINISTRY

Patti Barnhart along with Christie Hunt will be conducting the evening children's ministries.

Patti is also known as PJ the Clown. Specializing in children's ministries she uses the art of ventriloquism, music, puppets, Bible stories, and drama to teach Biblical truth. Patti resides in the Chambersburg area.

Christie attends Manor BIC Church where she is involved in a number of ministries. She

is a gifted teacher and has a heart for children. Christie resides in West Hempfield Township with her husband and two children.

MUSIC DIRECTOR

Dr. Bruce Gerlach serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a very gifted musician with a doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. He is professor of music at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri where he also serves as Director of Worship for the college church. Being the son of our association president, Norman Gerlach and his wife Elaine, Bruce has been a part of Camp since childhood. He and his wife Margie have two children.

CONCERT

Da'maris Carbaugh once sang from a perch atop the world's most capitalist pursuit advertising. Her voice was in demand on commercial jingles from the Big Apple's biggest names — Pepsi, Minute Maid, KFC, and other high-profile clients who ate up her talent with a big spoon. Yet something was terribly wrong. In her heart, she knew her music was spiritually tone deaf. "I finally realized that I didn't want a career, I wanted to be faithful to Christ; to be His servant," explains Da'maris. It is this bone-deep conviction that truly animates the artist's shining talents and gives her voice resonance and purpose.
