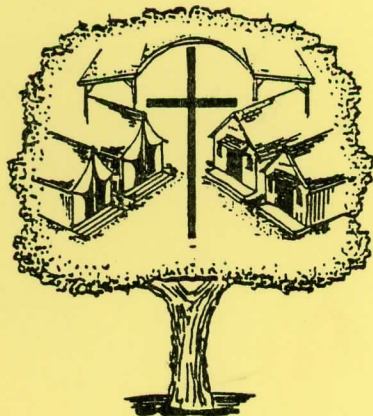

HISTORICAL

Shortly before the beginning of the 20th century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. The first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle—twenty feet by fifty feet was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now about one hundred sixty cabins.

Our present auditorium accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

The camp is incorporated functions as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

SPEAKERS

Rev. Arthur Larson is Vice President / Ministries of Global Outreach Mission Inc. and speaks regularly on Canada's National Bible Hour, a broadcast heard coast to coast every Sunday through 55 Canadian stations. He is also busily involved in conference ministry. In addition to conferences in this country and Canada, his association with Global Outreach Mission Inc. has given him opportunities to minister in many mission conferences and to missionaries in a number of foreign countries.

Rev. Larson's devotion to God and His people is evident in his compassionate and challenging presentation of Biblical Truth. Art and his wife, Wanda, have four children and live in Boca Raton, Florida.

Rev. Steve Layne is a Professor of Bible and Theology at Washington Bible College and Capital Bible Seminary. After receiving his Master of Divinity and Master of Theology degrees, Steve has been teaching for the past 11 years and working toward his doctorate in NT Greek. As he has the opportunity he serves as guest speaker for churches throughout the Washington area. Steve is a gifted speaker with a passion for communicating the Word of God. He and Jennifer, his wife, have three children.

Dr. Richard Emmons is Professor of Bible at Philadelphia Biblical University and Senior Pastor of Bible Baptist Church in Hamilton, NJ. He has been a Professor at PBU for 17 years and Pastor of Bible Baptist Church for 10 years. Prior to coming to PBU he was pastor of a church in New York and one in California, for a total of 14 years. As he has opportunity, he speaks at conferences and retreats. For recreation he enjoys playing tennis, reading and jogging. Richard and his wife, Fran, have two grown sons, Dan and Dave.

MUSIC DIRECTOR

Dr. Bruce Gerlach serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a very gifted musician with a doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. He is professor of music and chairman of the Fine Arts Division at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri where he also serves as Director of Worship for the college church. Being the son of our association president, Norman Gerlach and his wife Elaine, Bruce has been a part of Camp since childhood. He and his wife Margie have two children.

YOUTH MINISTRIES

Ed Weber and Josh Vanderplate are overseeing the Junior and Senior High ministry for the week. Ed is a graduate of Lancaster Bible College and he and his wife, Vicki, presently serve with LYNC (Lancaster Youth Network of Churches). They reside in the Willow Street area. Josh is Youth Pastor and Worship Leader at Habecker Mennonite Church and has been an active participant in the youth ministry at Camp Manor for a number of years.
