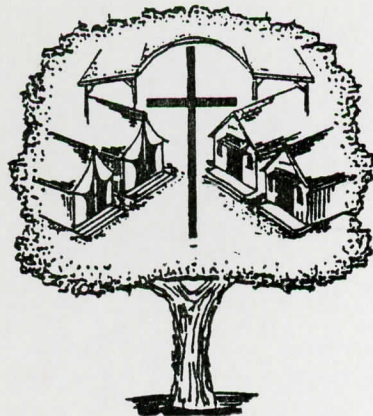

## HISTORICAL

Shortly before the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. The first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle-twenty feet by fifty feet was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now about one hundred sixty cabins.

Our present auditorium accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

The camp is incorporated and functions as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

## SPEAKERS

Dr. J. Ronald Blue presently serves as International Mobilizer of Latin Missions, CAM International, and Coordinator - Spanish Doctor of Ministries at Dallas Theological Seminary. Previously he served for seventeen years in the Department of World Missions at the seminary, and also eight years as CAM International's President. He has experience as a field missionary as well, having ministered two years in Guatemala. In addition to achieving numerous degrees and a variety of educational awards and honors, Dr. Blue has a wide range of experience having ministered in more than forty countries. His unique and Spirit-filled presentation of the Word of God communicated through his warm and enthusiastic personality will challenge and encourage you in your commitment to Christ. Ron and his wife, Libby, make their home in Dallas, TX and are the parents of three children.

Dr. Donald R. Hubbard presents the Scriptures with clarity, warmth and humor. His insights bring useful practical applications that will enlighten and encourage the hearer's mind and heart, and through his effective exposition of the Bible, the Scriptures become relevant and alive. Dr. Hubbard has served as the senior pastor of several churches in the eastern and southern United States including

the famed Calvary Baptist Church of New York City. In January 1994, Dr. Hubbard retired from the pastoral ministry in order to devote full time to assisting in the training of church and national leaders in developing countries as well as conducting Bible teaching ministries throughout the United States. His ministry has taken him to many countries throughout the world. Dr. Hubbard and his wife, Joy, reside in Boca Raton, Florida; they have four children and eight grandchildren.

Rev. Steve Layne is a Professor of Bible and New Testament Greek at Washington Bible College and Seminary. He has been teaching at the college and seminary for ten years while also continuing his education. In addition to his teaching responsibilities, Steve serves as a guest speaker for churches in the Washington area. Prior to joining WBC/CBS, he ministered for seven years as an associate pastor. Steve is a gifted and knowledgeable expository preacher who delivers the Word with clarity and passion. He and Jennifer, his wife, have three children and live in the Washington D.C. area.

### **MUSIC DIRECTOR**

Dr. Bruce Gerlach serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a gifted musician with a Doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. Bruce is professor of

Music and Chairman of the Fine Arts Division at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri where he serves as Director of Worship for the college church. His giftedness and earnest desire to involve people in worship combine to inspire great singing and meaningful worship at each of our services. Being the son of our association president, Norman Gerlach and his wife, Elaine, Bruce has been part of camp since childhood. He and Margie, his wife, have two children.

### **YOUTH MINISTRIES**

The Junior and Senior High ministry for the week will be under the oversight of Josh Vanderplate. Brad Gerlach as well as others will be involved in the teaching with Josh and the planning of other activities. Josh is the Associate Pastor and Worship Leader at Habecker Mennonite Church and has been involved in the youth ministry at Camp Manor for a number of years.

### **CHILDREN'S EVENING MINISTRY**

John Wesley Wagner Jr., of "AppleJohn Ministries, Ltd." will be ministering to the children in the evenings throughout the week. AppleJohn uses creative fine arts skills, i.e., music, humor, special effects, balloons, puppets, and interactive resource materials, to



proclaim the gospel and teach the Word of God. John and Judy, his wife, live in Baltimore, MD and have six children and seven grandchildren. They minister throughout the Mid-Atlantic region.

### CONCERT

The concert this year will feature the Taubl family, a musically gifted family of father, mother, and six children ranging from about age five through eighteen years.
