## HISTORICAL

Shortly before the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. The first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle-twenty feet by fifty feet was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now about one hundred sixty cabins.

Our present auditorium accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

The camp is incorporated and functions as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

## SPEAKERS

Rev. Walter McCord is a graduate of Pennsylvania State University, Philadelphia College of Bible, and Dallas Theological Seminary where he is currently completing a PH.D in Bible Exposition. Walt has been an assistant professor at Moody Graduate School in Chicago, IL for the past three years. Prior to joining the staff at Moody, he served in pastoral ministry for over 17 years. His gifts bring an ability to apply the scripture truth to the needs of our everyday Christian living. Walt and his wife Brenda have three sons, Mark, Jonathan and Seth. They reside in Schererville, IN.

Dr. Woodrow Kroll is President and Bible Teacher of "Back to the Bible International" head-quartered in Lincoln, Nebraska. Author of more than 50 books and a popular speaker at America's most loved Bible conferences, Woodrow Kroll is best known as the Bible teacher on the "Back to the Bible" broadcast, heard daily on hundreds of radio stations and translators around the world. In addition he is the speaker on the daily radio short feature "The Bible Minute" and the weekly television program also called "Back to the Bible". Dr. Kroll's clear, incisive and practical teaching of the Bible is widely appreciated throughout the world. He and his wife Linda make their home in Ashland, Nebraska. They have four grown children and 12 grandchildren.

Dr. Mark L. Bailey is president of Dallas Theological Seminary Since March of 2001.

Prior to that Dr. Bailey served as Provost and Vice President for Academic affairs and Academic Dean under Dr. Charles Swindoll from 1997 to 2001. Coming to Dallas Seminary in 1985, he first served as professor in the Bible Exposition Department. While serving in theological education ministry, he also served the pastorate both as an associate pastor and senior pastor giving him a wide range of experience. He has authored and co-authored books, articles for publications and theological papers, and is a gifted communicator of the Word. His passion is "to lead people to a love for God through the study of His word". Mark and his wife Barb have been married 30 years and have two sons: Joshua, married to Emily, and Jeremy.

Dr. Harry Fletcher is Vice President of International Ministry for Good News Jail & Prison Ministry. He provides the oversight for the training and support of chaplains for prisons in countries throughout the world. The ministry seeks to provide churches to partner with them in "Adopting a Chaplain in a Country" or "Adopting a Country of Chaplains". Dr. Fletcher has traveled to numerous countries throughout the world and has been able to provide and train 100 chaplains for prisons in Nigeria, Estonia, Uganda, Ghana, Egypt, India, Siberia, Kenya and Latvia, with requests for new international opportunities continuing to come. His previous ministries include serving as president of the Washington Bible College and Capitol Seminary and pastoral ministry in a number of churches

including The York Gospel Center. Harry and his wife Muriel reside in Mashpee, Massachusetts.

### **MUSIC DIRECTOR**

Dr. Bruce Gerlach serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a gifted musician with a Doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in in Louisville, Kentucky. Bruce is professor of Music and Chairman of the Fine Arts Division at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri. His giftedness and earnest desire to involve people in worship combine to inspire great singing and meaningful worship at each of our services. Being the son of our association president, Norman Gerlach and his wife, Elaine, Bruce has been part of camp since childhood. He and Margie, his wife, have two children.

### **YOUTH MINISTRIES**

The Junior and Senior High ministry for the week will be under the oversight of Josh Vanderplate. Brad Gerlach as well as others will be involved in the teaching with Josh and the planning of other activities. Josh is the Youth Pastor and Worship Leader at Habecker Mennonite Church and has been involved in the youth ministry at Camp Manor for a number of years.
