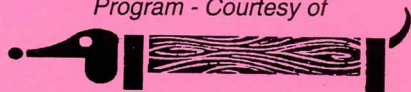

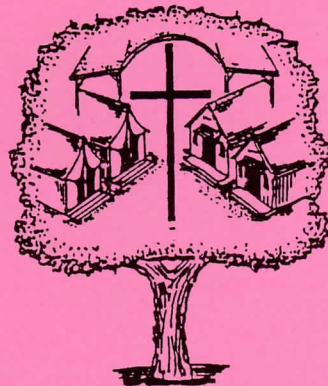

## HISTORICAL

Shortly before the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. The first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year the first tabernacle-twenty feet by fifty feet was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now about one hundred sixty five cabins.

Our present auditorium accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

The camp is incorporated and functions as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

## SPEAKERS

Dr. David A. Clemens has been involved in national and international Bible teaching ministry for over thirty-five years, traveling extensively throughout the United States as well as in thirty-one foreign countries. He is the author of "Steps to Maturity", an extensive three-volume/six-book set of practical Biblical studies that has been translated and used in eight languages. His domestic and overseas preaching/teaching responsibilities take him regularly to churches, summer Bible conferences, colleges, seminaries, retreats, and missions staff conventions. Dr. Clemens was a missionary/Bible teacher under the auspices of BCM International, Inc. (Formerly The Bible Club Movement, Inc.) for over thirty-two years and is now Bible Teacher and President of David Clemens Bible Teaching ministries, Inc. He has earned the Ph.D. and Th.D degrees. David and his wife, Janice reside in Marlton, NJ and have two married sons and four grandchildren.

Rev. Arthur Larson is Vice President/Ministries of Global Outreach Missions Inc. and speaks regularly on Canada's National Bible Hour, a broadcast heard coast to coast every Sunday through 55 Canadian stations. He is also busily involved in conference ministry. In addition to conferences in this country and Canada, his association with Global Outreach Missions Inc. has given him opportunities to minister in many mission conferences and to missionaries in a number of foreign countries. Rev. Larson's devotion to



God and His people is evident in his passionate and challenging presentation of Biblical truth. Art and his wife, Wanda, have four children and live in Boca Raton, Florida.

Dr. Gordon Johnston, a first-time speaker at Central Manor Camp, comes to us from Dallas, Texas, where he lives with his wife, Danielle, and three children, Bergen, Grey, and Heath. Gordon is Associate Professor, Department of Old Testament Studies at Dallas Theological Seminary. Prior to coming to the seminary in 1998, he served on the faculty at Lancaster Bible College and as associate pastor at Grace Baptist Church in Lancaster, PA. He has been involved in Archaeology Study Programs and conducted tours in the Middle East, and written a number of manuscripts for theological works such as the Bible Knowledge Commentary: Word Study Edition. He has received a number of professional awards and honors for his work.

### **MUSIC DIRECTOR**

Dr. Bruce Gerlach serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a gifted musician with a Doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. Bruce is professor of Music and Chairman of the Fine Arts Division at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri. His giftedness and earnest desire to involve people in worship combine to inspire great singing and meaningful worship at each of our services. Being the son of our association president, Norman Gerlach and his wife,

Elaine, Bruce has been part of camp since childhood. He and Margie, his wife, have two children.

### **YOUTH MINISTRIES**

The Junior and Senior High ministry for the week will be under the oversight of Gene Strait and Brad Gerlach. Gene will be doing the teaching for the week and Brad as well as others will be involved with helping and supervising other planned activities. Gene Strait is new to our camp ministry this year, but comes with much experience in working with youth. In addition to his involvement with a very active Bible Club at Cedar Crest High School where he teaches, he has led youth ministries at camps and conferences and also participated in short-term missions in Haiti, Peru, and Guyana. He has a Masters degree in Education and a Masters degree in Biblical Studies. Gene and his wife, Carol have three children and reside in the Manheim area.

### **CHILDREN'S EVENING MINISTRY**

John Wesley Wagner Jr., of "AppleJohn Ministries, Ltd." will be ministering to the children ages 4-3rd grade in the evenings throughout the week. Apple John uses creative fine arts skills, i.e., music, humor, special effects, balloons, puppets, and interactive resource materials, to proclaim the gospel and teach the Word of God. John and Judy, his wife, live in Baltimore, MD and have six children and seven grandchildren. They minister throughout the Mid-Atlantic region.

Jim Austin of jim austin:IMAGES will be ministering to the children ages 4<sup>th</sup> grade through 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Jim lives in Des Plaines, IL and has for 25 years provided Christ-centered entertainment for groups of all ages.
