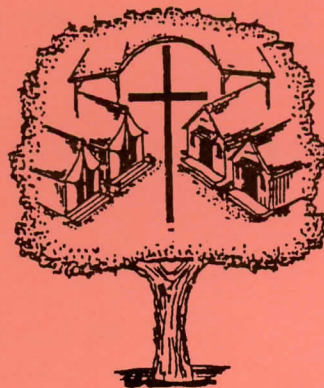

PURPOSE

Central Manor Campmeeting was established to glorify our God and Savior Jesus Christ through the edification of believers and the salvation of the lost. HISTORICAL

Shortly before the beginning of the 20th century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. The first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening, September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year, the first tabernacle - twenty feet by fifty feet, was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now about one hundred eighty cabins.

Our present auditorium accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat three hundred fifty at one meal.

The camp is incorporated and functions as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

We Believe:

The Bible is the Word of God! It is fully inspired by God to the very words and is true in every aspect in the original writing. It is therefore the only authority for faith and practice.

God is a Triune God! There is one God existing in three personalities; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, who are co-eternal in existence, co-equal in essence, and one in purpose.

Jesus Christ is the Only Savior of Men! By means of the incarnation, through the virgin birth, the second person of the trinity became the perfect Savior; wholly man and wholly God united in one person. The Son of God died a substitutionary death on the cross to redeem sinners, and rose bodily from the grave to give eternal life to all who believe in Him. He ascended to the right hand of the Father where he presently abides, and will come again in power and glory to receive and reward His own.

Man in his Natural State is Totally Depraved! Although created in the image of God, man by original sin has become the recipient of a sinful nature. As a result, man is sinfully enslaved in transgression, and without the provision of God's saving grace through Jesus Christ, is eternally lost.

SPEAKERS

Dr. Wendell Kempton Dr. Wendell W. Kempton is President Emeritus of the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism, Inc. He served as President for thirty years, from 1971-2001. He retired on March 1, 2001 but continues to actively represent ABWE through speaking engagements across the United States. Dr. Kempton received his academic training at Moody Bible Institute, Baptist Bible Seminary and Dallas Theological Seminary. He did graduate work at Syracuse University. He holds Th.B and Th.M. degrees, with majors in Theology and Christian Education. An honorary Doctor of Divinity degree was conferred upon him by Grand Rapids Baptist College and Seminary.

Dr. Woodrow Kroll Dr. Woodrow Kroll is President and Bible Teacher of the international media ministry, *Back to the Bible*. He is heard on over 1200 radio outlets in the United States and just about anywhere the English language is spoken in the world. Dr. Kroll also is heard on the short feature program, *The Bible Minute*, which airs on 943 outlets. Around the world, *Back to the Bible* broadcasts in 25 other languages from 13 offices with national staff. From humble beginnings in 1939, with one radio station in Lincoln, Nebraska, today half the world's population, 3.6 billion people, can turn on a radio and hear *Back to the Bible* programs in their own language.

Rev. Art Larson. Rev. Arthur Larson began his pastoral ministries as Assistant Pastor to the late Dr. Andrew Telford at Berachah Church in Philadelphia. He has served as senior pastor of a number of churches in the United States and Canada, as well as Associate Pastor and Conference Director for Boca Raton Community Church, Florida. Presently Rev. Larson is busily involved in conference ministry. His association with Global Outreach Mission has given him many opportunities to minister in mission conferences and to missionaries in the field. Art and his wife, Wanda, have four children and reside in Boca Raton, Florida.

MUSIC DIRECTOR

Dr. Bruce Gerlach serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a gifted musician with a Doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. Bruce is Professor of Music and Chairman of the Fine Arts Division at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri. His giftedness and earnest desire to involve people in worship combine to inspire great singing and meaningful worship at each of our services. Bruce has been part of camp since childhood. He and Margie, his wife, have two children.

YOUTH MINISTRIES

The Junior and Senior High Ministry for the week will be under the oversight of Joel Hess and Brad Gerlach. Joel will be doing the teaching during the week and Brad, along with others, will be involved with helping and supervising additional planned activities. Joel is new as a teacher, but is a Lancaster County native, and member of Manor Church where a mission trip in 2001 ignited in him a desire to serve the Lord more seriously. He and his wife, Kelly, live in Lancaster.

CHILDREN'S EVENING MINISTRY

John Wesley Wagner Jr., of "AppleJohn Ministries, Ltd." will be ministering to the children ages 4-3rd grade in the evenings throughout the week. AppleJohn uses creative fine arts skills, i.e., music, humor, special effects, balloons, puppets, and interactive resource materials, to proclaim the gospel and teach the Word of God. John and Judy, his wife, live in Baltimore, Maryland and have six children and seven grandchildren. They minister throughout the mid-Atlantic region.
