## HISTORICAL

Shortly before the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. The first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening, September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year, the first tabernacle - twenty feet by fifty feet, was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now about 190 cabins.

Our present tabernacle accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat four hundred at one meal.

The camp is incorporated and functions as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

## STATEMENT OF FAITH

### *We Believe:*

***The Bible is the Word of God!*** It is fully inspired by God to the very words and is true in every aspect in the original writing. It is therefore the only authority for faith and practice.

***God is a Triune God!*** There is one God existing in three personalities; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, who are co-eternal in existence, co-equal in essence, and one in purpose.

***Jesus Christ is the Only Savior of Men!*** By means of the incarnation, through the virgin birth, the second person of the trinity became the perfect Savior; wholly man and wholly God united in one person. The Son of God died a substitutionary death on the cross to redeem sinners, and rose bodily from the grave to give eternal life to all who believe in Him. He ascended to the right hand of the Father where he presently abides, and will come again in power and glory to receive and reward His own.

***Man in his Natural State is Totally Depraved!*** Although created in the image of God, man by original sin has become the recipient of a sinful nature. As a result, man is sinfully enslaved in transgression, and without the provision of God's saving grace through Jesus Christ, is eternally lost.

## SPEAKERS

**Rev. Arthur Larson** Rev. Larson is a board member of Global Outreach Missions Inc., and speaks regularly on radio and in conference ministries in Canada and the United States. In addition to those conferences, his association with Global Outreach Missions Inc. has given him opportunities to minister in many mission conferences and to missionaries in a number of foreign countries. Rev. Larson's devotion to God and His people is evident in his passionate and challenging presentation of Biblical truth. Art and his wife Wanda have four children and live in Boca Raton, Florida.

**Dr. Ron Blue** Dr. J. Ronald Blue has served with the Central American Mission (CAM) for about 18 years; both as a field missionary in Guatemala and later in leadership ministry. From 1975 to 1992, he was chairman and professor of World Missions at Dallas Theological Seminary (DTS). He served as president of CAM International from 1992-2000. From 2000 to the present he has been the coordinator of the Spanish-language Doctor of Ministries program at DTS. His duties have taken him to over 40 countries around the world. He presently resides in Dallas, Texas with his wife Libby. They are the parents of three children.

**Dr. Johnny Miller** Jeanne and Johnny Miller have been married almost 47 years, and have invested more than 40 of those years in ministry, including missions, church planting, Bible college and seminary teaching, educational administration, and pastorate. They have two children, who are both missionaries with Christar, and five grandchildren. Johnny served as pastor of Calvary Church in Lancaster from 1999-2009. He resigned after eight years as president of Columbia International University to return to his first love of teaching scripture, discipling, and church leadership. Jeanne worked as an R.N. until called to home making with the birth of their first child. She uses her gentle gift of hospitality and her prayer ministry to partner with Johnny. Johnny is a graduate of Arizona State University, and of Dallas Seminary (Th.M. and Th.D.). He was also a sports writer and high school teacher.

## MUSIC DIRECTOR

**Dr. Bruce Gerlach** serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a gifted musician with a Doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. Bruce is Professor of Music and Chairman of the Fine Arts Division at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri. His giftedness and earnest desire to involve people in worship combine to inspire great singing and meaningful worship at each of our services. Bruce has been part of camp since childhood. He and his wife, Margie, have two children.

## **YOUTH MINISTRIES**

Mark Goodman will direct the Middle School and High School Ministry for the week. Mark will be doing the teaching during the morning hour. Mark is no stranger to Central Manor as he has been attending camp for several years. He is presently serving as Lead Pastor at Christ Community Ministries in Estero, FL. He resides in Florida with his wife, Donnitta and their two children.

Evening sessions for Middle School and High School students are planned during the week. The times and leaders will be announced during the week.

## **CHILDREN'S EVENING MINISTRY**

John Wesley Wagner Jr., of "AppleJohn Ministries, Ltd." will be ministering to the children ages 4 yrs. to 3rd grade in the evenings throughout the week. AppleJohn uses creative fine arts skills, i.e., music, humor, special effects, balloons, puppets, and interactive resource materials to proclaim the gospel and teach the Word of God. John and Judy, his wife, live in Baltimore, MD and have six children and seven grandchildren.

## **CONCERT**

Our Saturday evening concert this year will be brought to us by The Pfeifers. The Pfeifer family is one that knows the true meaning of the term, "fighting on!" The Pfeifers have been pressing forward and fighting on in their walk with Christ for over 70 years. In the 1930s, their grandfathers began singing together and traveling to campmeetings and tent revivals all across the state of Ohio. There was a unique anointing on these two men, and God richly blessed each time the two stood to sing with guitar and mandolin in hands, as well as their trusted songbook, which contained more than 100 songs written by the two. Over the years, the ministry of The Pfeifers has evolved and experienced change; however, God's anointing and blessings still remain. The Pfeifers of today include Don Pfeifer's oldest son, John, long-time friend, Mary Jane Carter, who has been with the group for the past 24 years, and Candy, an original member. The group travels in excess of 150 days each year, sharing the message of the Gospel.
