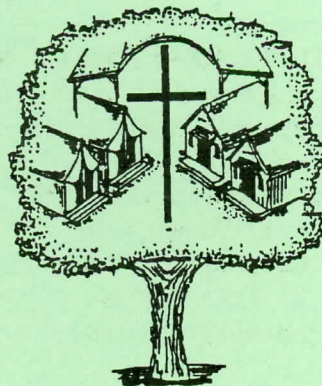

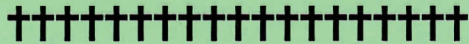

HISTORICAL

Shortly before the beginning of the 20th century, in an era when campmeetings were springing up in many places, our founder, Dr. I. A. MacDannald got the vision to start a campmeeting in the beautiful wooded area which we now occupy.

The Council of the Church of God at Washington Boro, of which Dr. MacDannald was pastor, agreed to cooperate if he could secure twenty tents and rent the ground. The first camp opened with nineteen tents on Thursday evening, September 7, 1892.

In 1905 the Central Manor Campmeeting Association was formed. In the same year, the first tabernacle - twenty feet by fifty feet, was built and action was taken to build a dining hall.

Tents were used exclusively until 1926 when three cabins were built. There are now about 190 cabins.

Our present tabernacle accommodates approximately one thousand people. The dining hall is able to seat four hundred at one meal.

The camp is incorporated and functions as a non-denominational campmeeting and Bible Conference facility, where the fundamental truths of the Word of God are faithfully proclaimed.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

We Believe:

The Bible is the Word of God! It is fully inspired by God to the very words and is true in every aspect in the original writing. It is therefore the only authority for faith and practice.

God is a Triune God! There is one God existing in three personalities; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, who are co-eternal in existence, co-equal in essence, and one in purpose.

Jesus Christ is the Only Savior of Men! By means of the incarnation, through the virgin birth, the second person of the trinity became the perfect Savior; wholly man and wholly God united in one person. The Son of God died a substitutionary death on the cross to redeem sinners, and rose bodily from the grave to give eternal life to all who believe in Him. He ascended to the right hand of the Father where he presently abides, and will come again in power and glory to receive and reward His own.

Man in his Natural State is Totally Depraved! Although created in the image of God, man by original sin has become the recipient of a sinful nature. As a result, man is sinfully enslaved in transgression, and without the provision of God's saving grace through Jesus Christ, is eternally lost.

SPEAKERS

Dr. John Soden currently is a professor in the Bible and Theology Department of Lancaster Bible College specializing in Old Testament studies. He has held this position since 1998. He has taught on both the undergrad and graduate levels in all of the Old Testament as well as hermeneutics and some pastoral ministries. Previously he was pastor of Arriola Bible Church near Cortez, Colorado for over 9 years. He received his B.S. from Biola University; and Th.M. and Ph.D. degrees from Dallas Theological Seminary emphasizing Semitics and OT studies. He grew up in Oregon in a pastor's family and has been interested in some sort of full time service to Christ since he was a teenager. After the doctoral program, the Lord provided a great place to grow and learn in ministry in Colorado. The pastorate was a wonderful experience but very difficult to leave, but teaching has always been a passion and a pleasure. He is married and has three grown children.

Thomas Telford was born and raised in the family of a pastor and well known evangelist. Becoming a Christian later in life, Tom was constrained by the biblical mandate to take the Gospel to the whole world. Tom is self-educated in missions and has invested his adult life in helping churches maximize their potential for world evangelization. Tom was Missions Chairman for 10 years at Berachah Church in Cheltenham, Pennsylvania, and

Mission's Director for five more years at Cheltenham Baptist Church in Dresher Pennsylvania. Mr. Telford is currently the Vice President of Mobilization for United World Mission. Prior to that, he served 15 years with ACMC (Advancing Churches in Missions Commitment) as North Northeast Regional Director and Supervisor of Regional Ministries. Tom has co-authored two books with Lois Shaw. The first entitled *Missions in the 21st Century* was published by Shaw Publishing in Wheaton Ill. His second book *Today's All-Star Missions Churches* is published by Baker Book House in Grand Rapids, MI.

Dr. Ronald Susek is President of Susek Evangelistic Association (SEA) Gettysburg, PA. SEA helps to build up and expand the body of Christ by offering extensive help to local churches in the areas of spiritual development, evangelism and conflict mediation. Ron graduated from Washington Bible College and holds two honorary doctorates. He has authored five books including, *Firestorm: Preventing and Overcoming Church Conflict*, *God Will Answer* and *Holding Nothing Back: A Portrait of Perseverance*. Ron speaks at crusades, Bible conferences, pastors' conferences and seminars across the continent. His work has also taken him outside the United States to Africa, India, Central America and Micronesia. He resides with his wife, recording artist, Diane near York, PA.

Mark Cahill has a business degree from Auburn University, where he was an honorable mention Academic All-American in basketball. After spending a few years in the business world, he surrendered his heart to Jesus Christ and asked God to place him where he could touch as many lives as possible. Within a year, he was teaching school. Although Mark planned to teach for the rest of his life, God moved him from teaching at a christian high school to devoting a year to full-time evangelism. He then embarked on a speaking career. Mark speaks to thousands each year at churches, retreats, conferences, camps, etc., equipping and challenging the saved to go out and reach the lost. As one of his students noted, he's still teaching but in a much bigger classroom. His true vocation is witnessing, whether at malls, music and art festivals, beaches, sporting events, bar sections of towns— wherever the lost can be found. Mark is the author of *One Thing You Can't Do In Heaven* and *One Heartbeat Away*. Mark lives in Stone Mountain, Georgia.

Dr. Stephen Bramer is Department Chair and Professor of Bible Exposition at Dallas Theological Seminary. He also serves as Teaching Pastor at Waterbrook Bible Fellowship in Wylie, TX. Stephen is known for his practical, humorous and expositional Bible teaching. His commentary on Genesis has been published in both English and Korean, and he continues to add to his *Bible Reader's Joke Book*. Stephen also serves as Adjunct

Professor at the Jordan Evangelical Theological Seminary in Amman, Jordan, at Word of Life Bible Institute in Hungary, and at Montana Wilderness School of the Bible. Stephen, originally from Canada, frequently lead tours to Israel and Jordan and has just returned from teaching missionaries for three weeks in the Middle East. Stephen and Sharon have been married for thirty-six years and are the proud parents of two married daughters, Sarah and Charity, a married son Joshua and proud grandparents of three.

MUSIC DIRECTOR

Dr. Bruce Gerlach serves as our Camp Music Director. He is a gifted musician with a Doctorate in Music from Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. Bruce is Professor of Music and Chairman of the Fine Arts Division at the College of the Ozarks in Missouri. His giftedness and earnest desire to involve people in worship combine to inspire great singing and meaningful worship at each of our services. Bruce has been part of camp since childhood. He and his wife, Margie, have two children.

YOUTH MINISTRIES

Mark Goodman will direct the Middle School and High School Ministry for the week. Mark will be doing the teaching during the morning hour. Mark is no stranger to Central Manor as he has been attending camp for several years. He is presently serving as Lead Pastor at Christ Community Ministries in Estero, FL. He resides in Florida with his wife, Donnitta and their two children.
